

What is the relationship between Jung's concept of individuation and our commitment to others? What attitudes and behavior support individuation and help us move from misery to meaning?

This book shows how we may travel the Middle Passage consciously, thereby rendering our lives more meaningful and the second half of life immeasurably richer.

The author of this much heralded book is James Hollis. Dr. Hollis trained as a Jungian analyst at the Jung Institute of Zurich, Switzerland. He is presently a licensed Jungian analyst in private practice in Washington, D.C. and is the author of 16 books.

John P. Schuster is an author, coach and educator who speaks to a wide range of audiences in various stages of their aging process. He has worked in adult development for many years, first for those in early and mid-career and more recently for those in later-life stages. His work in *Aging with Intention* took root in earnest in 2011 and he is a regular resource as a coach and as a teacher/singer for a variety of individuals and audiences in various stages of the second half of life. He produced podcasts with Public Radio, *Stories for the Ages*, on aging consciously, which are carried by NPR. He holds advanced degrees in literature and Jungian psychology and has four grandkids in Columbus, reminding him and his wife Patricia that the second half of life has its joys.
